Hosea 1:1

Introduction:

Human author is Hosea. His name means <u>salvation</u>, and is the same Hebrew name translated Joshua or Hoshea (Numbers 13:8,16). The Greek equivalent is Jesus.

Hosea was a profit of God in Israel (Northern Kingdom) from 755BC until the dispersion of Israel by the Assyrians in 722BC, when it seems that Hosea went to Judah and lived until his death around 710BC.

His Ministry was after that of Elijah and Elisha and followed directly after that of Amos. His contemporaries in Judah (Southern Kingdom) were Isaiah and Micah.

Hosea's ministry started while Jeroboam II was king; during a time of political and economic prosperity, but spiritual drought.

Through Hosea we see God's sacrificial love for unfaithful people.
